Our trek started in the capital area of Kampala reaching to the Districts of Nebbi, Arua, Gulu, Pader, Soroti, and Jinja.

We ran basketball clinics for girls, donated basketballs, training uniforms and practice equipment. We also empowered coaches by providing each with the necessary tools to help them appreciate and teach the game of basketball to the girls.

Teammates Scholarship Program

Thank you to our supporters who have provided 30 plus children with educational scholarships for 2016. We visited and identified 6 districts throughout Uganda who will each have 5 children participate in our Teammates Scholarship Program. In each district we placed a teacher/coach responsible for coordinating and overseeing the program to insure our requirements are met for each of the 3 semesters per year. These children will also have the opportunity to be participants in our sports program. The fee of \$300 per year, \$100 per semester, will provide each child education, immunizations, uniform, access to learning computer skills and sports instruction. Thank you to all who have sponsored a child.

Three children from Nebbi District chosen for the Teammates Educational Scholarship Program.



Elizabeth from Soroti District is a participant in the Teammates Scholarship Program. She is a cancer survivor who was introduced to Teammates by an International Rotarian member as vulnerable. Elizabeth missed 1 year of school due to treatments sponsored by the Uganda International Rotary. She is cancer free and doctors say a "miracle," as they originally diagnosed her to live three months. She lives with her mother and continues to be monitored. She is happy to be back with friends.



Pader

Five of these children from Pader District will attend school this February. Leaving their village and families for the first time. The closest school is in the next district, Kitgum, 25 miles away. This will require them to move closer to school and visit their family and village occasionally.

Children given this opportunity impact not only the future of their family but the whole village. We must not forget in these remote villages the child's absence is the loss of a family worker. This is why each of our district coordinator's responsibility is to visit the children's family and communicate with the children's sponsors on a regular basis.


Education and Sports

Projects and Goals for Teammates in 2016





Each of the 6 Districts were provided Starter Kits consisting of: mesh ball bags a stopwatch, whistle, pump, balls and laptop computers.

Coaches are now able to communicate with each other and our program leaders. They are required to teach players to also use the computer to communicate with their *sponsors* and *Teammates from the USA*.
